The opportunities ahead are generational.

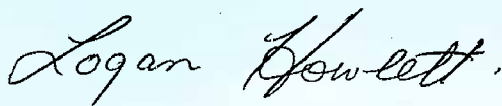

Cockburn is open for business

Continuous naval shipbuilding is reshaping WA's defence and advanced manufacturing landscape – and Cockburn is the beating heart of this transformation. The Australian Marine Complex, a centre for submarine sustainment and shipbuilding, is attracting substantial Federal investment and private sector partnerships. For investors, this creates long-term opportunities across defence industries, shipbuilding, advanced manufacturing, housing, logistics, technology and workforce development.

With strong government backing, a highly skilled workforce and proximity to critical infrastructure, Cockburn is ideally positioned to capitalise on the multi-billion-dollar growth flowing through the shipbuilding and defence sectors.

Henderson now hosts Australia's first genuine commitment to continuous naval shipbuilding: a contracted pipeline extending well into the next decade sustaining demand for steel fabrication, systems integration, logistics and marine trades across the City of Cockburn.

That defence momentum is reinforced by a deep foundation in energy services. The Australian Marine Complex was purpose-built to serve defence, oil and gas, and resources industries from shared infrastructure, producing a cluster of firms whose capabilities translate directly into the defence supply chain.

For investors and supply chain businesses, this structural depth is a rare and compelling proposition.

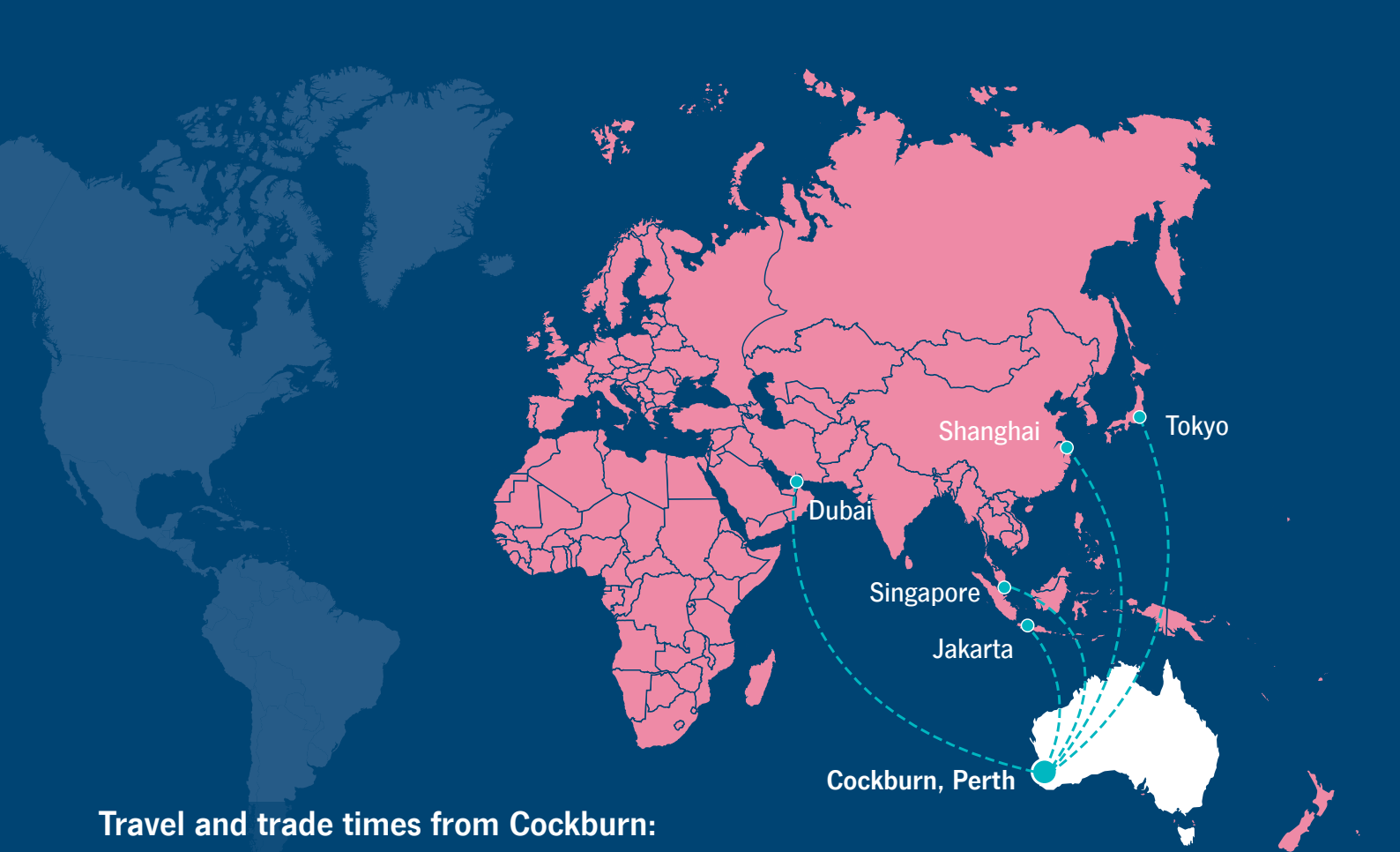

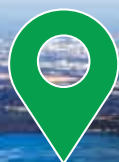

Western Trade Coast at a Glance

WA's global advanced industry hub

The Western Trade Coast (WTC) is Western Australia's premier industrial region – a powerhouse of economic activity and global trade. Located 23 kilometres south of Perth, it stretches across 3,900 hectares along the Cockburn Sound coastline, delivering unrivalled access to shipping and freight corridors across the Indian and Pacific oceans.

The WTC supports 42,900 direct and indirect jobs, accounting for three per cent of the State's workforce, and generates around \$20 billion annually for the WA economy. It is home to the headquarters of global leaders in shipbuilding, advanced manufacturing, energy and resources, anchoring WA's role in the Indo-Pacific.



Northern Strengths – Australian Marine Complex

A sovereign hub for defence, shipbuilding and sustainment, and subsea technologies, it is central to Australia's national security agenda and is set to grow rapidly under the AUKUS security partnerships. These partnerships will bring generational investment in submarine sustainment and advanced shipbuilding to Cockburn.



Southern Strengths – Kwinana and Rockingham Industry Zones

This area is an industrial powerhouse for chemical processing, advanced manufacturing, minerals and battery metals refining, and cement and lime manufacturing.



Westport

Westport is a planned container terminal at the Kwinana Outer Harbour, designed to support WA's long-term freight and export requirements. It includes road and rail networks to connect Cockburn and surrounding logistics hubs.

This project will strengthen Cockburn's export capacity and further catalyse advanced industries including renewable energy, hydrogen production and shipbuilding manufacturing through continuous naval shipbuilding projects.

Why it matters

At the heart of the WTC, Cockburn is where shipbuilding, industry and innovation converge. The city's concentration of employment hubs — the Australian Marine Complex, Bibra Lake Commercial Precinct, Jandakot Commercial Precinct and Cockburn Central — has established Cockburn as a national centre for advanced manufacturing, technology development and sovereign capability.

Continuous naval shipbuilding amplifies that advantage. Generational defence investments will flow directly into the region, driving unprecedented demand for local supply chains, advanced skills and innovation capability. For investors and businesses seeking to scale, diversify or connect with future defence and industrial growth, Cockburn offers a strategic location, industrial depth and long-term opportunity.

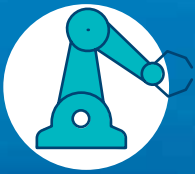

Cockburn is the heart of Australia's sovereign maritime capability – a national centre where defence, energy and resources come together to power continuous naval shipbuilding, sustainment and maritime innovation. At the Australian Marine Complex more than 400 businesses support naval sustainment, subsea engineering and advanced fabrication. Thousands of highly skilled workers deliver projects that underpin both national security and WA's \$200 billion resources economy.

The AUKUS agreement and Australia's renewed focus on sovereign capability position Cockburn at the centre of a generational transformation. Submarine sustainment, robotics, composites and modular fabrication capabilities developed here serve not only defence but also the mining and offshore energy sectors.

The facility delivers end-to-end capability, including vessel design and development, manufacturing and through-life support services such as sustainment, refit and repairs.

Today, Austal is recognised as a global leader in the design and construction of tailored commercial and defence vessels, supplying ferry operators, navies and defence forces worldwide. The Henderson shipyard has evolved in step with the company, adopting an advanced modular manufacturing approach that has established it as a cornerstone of Australia's defence shipbuilding capability — delivering multiple shipbuilding programs for the Australian Government, including Evolved Cape-class Patrol Boat, Landing Craft Medium and Landing Craft Heavy.

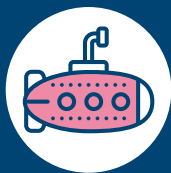

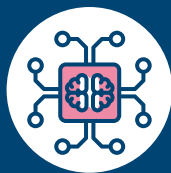

Cockburn is one of WA's most connected industrial cities, ideally located at the intersection of road, rail, port and aviation networks. Major freight corridors – including Kwinana Freeway, Roe Highway and Tonkin Highway – deliver seamless north-south and east-west connectivity across the Perth metropolitan region and beyond to the eastern states. Direct freight rail links connect Cockburn's industrial zones to the Kewdale Intermodal Terminal, unlocking interstate supply chains.

Aviation amplifies this connectivity. Jandakot Airport is WA's busiest general aviation hub by aircraft movements, supporting charter services, pilot training, light freight, emergency and medical aviation, and the Amazon distribution centre. The airport is also emerging as a hub for drone logistics and defence-related aviation applications, adding agility to Cockburn's multimodal transport ecosystem.

Cockburn's manufacturing industries – from advanced fabrication to logistics and resource support services – are deeply integrated with these networks, enabling businesses to move products, parts and people efficiently across the state and into global markets.

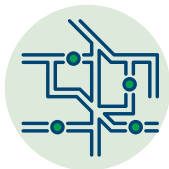

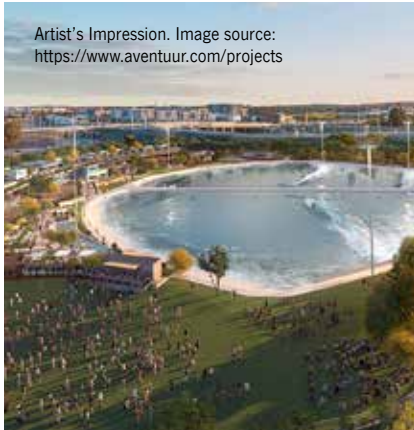

Spotlight/feature:



Perth Surf Park is a proposed \$120 million high-tech 2.2-hectare surfing lagoon and tourism destination just south of the Perth CBD. It will produce up to 1,000 consistent, high-quality waves per hour, making surfing accessible to all skill levels. Expected to welcome up to a million guests a year and designed to operate year-round, day and night, the precinct will integrate surfing with a boutique hotel, health and wellness facilities, co-working spaces and event venues. A high-performance surf academy, beach club and curated mix of bars and restaurants will support both local use and visitor appeal. This development is due for completion in late 2027.



Cockburn ARC is an award-winning recreation facility. Visitors can enjoy indoor and outdoor heated pools, perfect for year-round swimming. Sports enthusiasts can take advantage of the multi-sport indoor stadium, while fitness lovers have access to a fully equipped gym and relaxing sauna. The ARC also partners with the Fremantle Dockers football team, providing elite training programs and community engagement opportunities.



Coogee Maritime Trail is Western Australia's first underwater and land-based maritime heritage trail, anchored by the historic Omeo Shipwreck. Located just 25 metres from shore, the award-winning trail offers an accessible snorkelling and diving experience that brings together maritime history, underwater art and a purpose-built artificial reef. Shallow water depths make the trail suitable for snorkellers and beginner divers, while still offering interest for experienced explorers.
