

Children’s Art Competition “Peaceful Towns” 2019

Application Guidelines

1. Summary

Mayors for Peace is holding an art competition on the theme of “Peaceful Towns” targeted at children from 6 to 15 years old who live in Mayors for Peace member cities. The artwork that wins the Mayors for Peace President Award will be printed on Mayors for Peace plastic folders, which will be distributed at various events to raise awareness of the importance of peace education.

2. Applicant Requirements

Children from 6 to 15 years old as of June 1, 2019, who live in Mayors for Peace member cities

3. Artwork Requirements

- B4-sized (257mm × 364mm) flat artwork that can be scanned. There are no rules about materials.
- Artworks must be made by the applicants themselves and not have been submitted to other competitions.
- Artworks must not infringe on the rights of a third party, such as copyright (including that for animated characters), trademarks, and the right of publicity.

4. Application Procedure

Applicants should submit their artwork with the application form attached to the back of the artwork to the city hall of the Mayors for Peace member city where they live. The member city will then select 5 artworks each for Category I (6-10 years old) and Category II (11-15 years old). The selected artworks and their application forms should be converted into PDF format and sent to the Mayors for Peace Secretariat by email with a completed submission form.

5. Schedule

- (1) Application period: From June 3 (Mon.) to September 20 (Fri.), 2019
- (2) Announcement of selection results: Late October, 2019 (on the Mayors for Peace website)
- (3) Creation of plastic folders: November, 2019

6. Selection Details

(1) Through careful screening by the Mayors for Peace Secretariat, one First Prize, two Second Prize and three Third Prize artworks will be selected in each category. To those prize winners, a certificate and a commemorative gift will be presented.

(2) The Mayors for Peace President Award will be given to one of the two First Prize artworks. A certificate for the Mayors for Peace President Award and 20 plastic folders on which the artwork is printed will be presented to the award winner.

* After the winner of the Mayors for Peace President Award is decided, the Mayors for Peace Secretariat will have the member city with the winner send the original artwork to the Secretariat.

7. Notes

- (1) One applicant can submit one artwork only.
- (2) The right to use submitted artworks is owned by the Mayors for Peace Secretariat. The submitted artworks will not be returned.
- (3) As for the Mayors for Peace President Award and the outstanding performance prize, the creators' artworks, names, ages, member cities, and messages regarding their works will be posted on the Mayors for Peace website.
