2 Free Street Tree

Under the City's tree planting program you can request a free street tree for the verge in front of your property.

Street trees provide a range of benefits: they can increase property value, reduce heat in our suburbs and promote wellbeing.

Trees clean the air, create natural screens and provide habitat. They act as wind and noise buffers and reduce the need for air-conditioning.

Be a Good Sort!

Here are our top tips to reduce the amount of waste you send to landfill:



Recycling: This bin is for items that can be recycled – hard plastic bottles and containers, glass bottles and jars, metal tins, paper and cardboard. The contents of this bin will be sorted and sent for recycling.



Garden Organics: This bin is for anything that has grown in your garden – grass clippings, prunings, twigs and leaves. The contents of this bin will be processed into mulch, which you can collect for free from Henderson Waste Recovery Park!



General Waste: If it can't be recycled or mulched, put it in this bin. This includes nappies, meat trays, food waste and fabrics.

BONUS TIPS

Food waste: Invest in a compost bin or worm farm to process your food waste at home and create awesome fertiliser for your garden.

Soft-plastics: To recycle soft plastics, take them to your local REDcycle collection point. See **redcycle.net.au** for locations

Batteries, mobile phones, light globes and printer cartridges: These can be disposed of at your local library (Spearwood, Coolbellup or Success).

Aerosols: Drop these off at the Administration Centre or Henderson Waste Recovery Park for safe disposal.

9 Bird Bath Rebate
