




We are all different

You may have a disability.




You may have no disability.

Access means


• you are safe when you move around

• you can get the information you want.


When access is good we say it is accessible.



Inclusion means you feel like you are part of the community.


When inclusion is good we say it is **inclusive**.

We say you are **included**.




Our plan

You must be able to use them.




Like

you can park your car




• you are safe on our roads and paths.

Like


• new buildings

Goal 4. Good service


Our workers must treat you well

We will teach them about accessibility and inclusion.




We will make sure they know how to help people with disability.



Goal 5. Tell us what you think


You can tell us when we are good or bad.

We say you take part in **public consultation**.




We will make it easier to tell us what you think.
